

Minutes from the September Meeting:

11 members attended the September meeting. The club sponsored a pizza treat before the meeting as a "Thank you" to this year's show helpers. The meeting began at 7:12 with the normal introductions. We had a show sign round-up. Any signs that were returned at the meeting were taken to the storage shed after the meeting by Scott Sutherland. Joanna gave the Treasurer's report and passed around a profit/loss

statement from the show and graph of income over the years. Bill noted that the egg cartons utilized for the kids's mineral kits were never received from Price Chopper this year. We checked in with Price Chopper just before the meeting tonight and they said that next year they will be sure to put the order in much earlier. Bill let the club know that we were asked to make a donation, if possible, towards long-time club member Paul Rice's burrial expenses. Davie Millis motioned that the club donate \$100.00; seconded by Roy -- motion passed unanimously. It was mentioned that the pavilion rental fee went up \$200.00 this year and that there is still no Wi-Fi there. We feel it's an unacceptable situation because our vendors are loosing out on sales. The Jr. Hockey league was supposed to help to get Wi-Fi installation set in motion, but nothing has come of it yet. Bill said members and vendors should write their concerns attention Mike Dalton, Mayor. Bob Taillon had a lady he had to turn away and Bill said another vendor lost much in sales also. Someone called Bill before the show and talked about an environmentalist who advised her to "throw out" any of the tremolite that her son collected, that it was hazardous to their health. 

Friday Sept. 21 -- We will visit Rose Road in Pitcairn for much of the day. I am trying to set up a visit to the Valentine Mine in Harrisville (either inside or at the gate) that can work with the mine operator. (Due to 7-day/week operations and liability issues this part of the trip has been cancelled).

There is a \$5 fee for collecting at Rose Road. The club will pay this fee for WCGMC members.

Saturday, Sept. 22 - We will visit Benson Mines in Star Lake. We will meet at the IGA food store in Route 3 in Star Lake with plans to depart for the mine dumps at 9:00 AM. Bill deLorraine of the St. Lawrence Club is working with the caretaker there in an effort to have the dumps with the muscovite and pegmatite turned over. If this happens this visit will carry a \$10 per adult collecting fee to pay for this work and the club will cover the remainder of
