Notes From the "Prez"

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of you who helped to make this year's show the great success that it was. I am happy to report to you that in the final analysis our club had one of the best "bottom lines" ever, if not the best! This is due in part because we had to, for the first time ever, charge an admission fee; more importantly the auction performed at an all-time high. Proceeds for the amethyst cathedral raffle set a record high as well.

So, where to from here? Last year's funds were running low and as a consequence we had to reduce scholarship checks to St. Lawrence Univ. and SUNY Potsdam Geology Departments to \$300.00 each rather than the usual \$500.00.

This year we could return to the customary \$500.00 scholarship per institution or we could do something altogether new. Something that potentially includes more students with hands on exposure to minerals, mineralogical research, presentations, professional mineralogists and researchers – Symposia. I am thinking of granting say, \$600.00 per institution purposed for student travel, expenses to the Rochester Mineralogical Symposium. This could involve student research work and presentation of results there at the Symposium. I think this would be a good way to involve students more directly with what we do in our endeavors, hands-on mineralogy and collection; as well as the educational research benefits. It is a good forum for meeting prominent researchers in

the mineralogical field, for meeting collectors, such as ourselves, to have a look at excellent displays of quality minerals from vendors many of whom set up at our own show in Canton. I think that this type of exposure has the potential to set the stage for interested students to develop firmer roots and deeper interests and shared experiences in our chosen hobby.
