Notes & Minutes from the September 6th Meeting

There were 18 members attending the September meeting. Bill welcomed everyone and we went around the room with introductions. Bill gave the Treasurer's report in Paisley's absence. Next year's show dates are the 24th and 25th of August. We took in more show signs. Signs are one of the most effective forms of advertising we have. Heather asked if we could get more signs. Bill noted that this is listed on the agenda. Signs were individually numbered this year, with numbers corresponding to specific locales on the regional map. Bill noted that it is not particularly helpful to "plant" signs outside one's own area. Nor is pulling other members' signs without informing them. One member traveled over 200 miles only to find the sign was already picked up by someone else! Bill had 20 new show signs made, this time printing our telephone number on them in case they were taken down or lost. We

have installed industrial Velcro tape on all of our signs now so the dates can be easily peeled off the next year. Under "recap of the show" he noted that Dino had 80 participants at the fluorescent hunt. And another record set for "Mineral Kits for Kids": 370. Dino needs double the number of egg cartons for next year. Bill noted that Dave Millis was very busy this year, having had a full table of wire wrapping participants most of the time. Also noted was that the Pavilion had online, real time posting of our show. Thank you, **Pavilion Director Meghan Richardson! Next year Meghan is having Pavilion** staff set up the electric cords for us. Under "Advertising" we had ads in "North Country Now", WDT, Tribune Press and on our Club's website, FB, "Rockhounds of Upstate NY" and other smaller sites. Heather asked if we could email her the two ads and she will print some to take to her upcoming shows. Under "New Business": Bill asked how do we want to celebrate "After the Show". We decided on having pizza at our next meeting in October. We voted on increasing our Mineralogy scholarships to Potsdam and SLU. to \$1,500 each. Bob Taillon made the motion; Joanna second the motion. The motion carried. Bob mentioned that for the floor plan, we could fit more vendors in next year. It was mentioned that we could put a banner in the park, many would see it. Lots of traffic in

Canton. The Presbyterian church in the past has not allowed. Jason Fogg looked up the head of the church so we can call and ask again. Heather asked "why do we charge again on Sunday if they are just coming back?" Should they be able to keep a ticket and come again on Sunday? We discussed and the consensus was, yes, we will keep charging for both days. Noted that all other mineral shows do the same.

There was much discussion on lifetime memberships. In years past there were always lifetime memberships. Most were original members of the club and had been members for well over 25 years; decisions were made by "Presidential prerogative".

Bill asked what everyone wanted as a benchmark to reach this milestone, 25 or 30 years as a member. No decisions were reached other than to bestow the lifetime membership to two persons. Bob also told us about a rock identifier app on your phone that can scan a rock and tell you what it is. It would be perfect to show at schools to children. He also noted that our ads should list "NY" after "Canton" as our location as many people travel here from other states. Bill noted that Dino has a connection for black lights. We can purchase LW lights for \$10.00 each for children at our fluorescent hunt; a very reasonable price. We also noted that LW lights are much safer for children's eyes than SW lights. We talked about by-laws. Joanna has the

originals that she typed. We need to update them and send to all members to vote on to accept. Heather O'Hara won the door prize of Peruvian Pyrite crystals. We will have "thank-you" cards to pass around and sign at the next meeting. These are to send to landowners as expressions of our thanks and gratitude for allowing us to collect on their properties and for our webmaster who does so much work for us as well!
