Last Meeting
There were 17 people in
attendance at the August
meeting. Jerry Curcio won
the drawing for a calcite
specimen. No minutes were
available to be read from the
last meeting. The treasurer,
Chris Sutherland read her
report. Chris and Scott
bought \$180.00 worth of
minerals for our monthly
drawing for the year. Many
were purchased from the

State Museum's table at the Syracuse show. Bill made an aerial satellite map of the show site and where the dealers should be parked outside in case of inclement weather. The field tends to flood where they normally have parked in past years and our club has been told we would be responsible for damage to the lawn. So to avoid this from happening Bill has had the foresight to have other plans. Bob Taillon gave his report on the show. He said we had told the Marines we would cover 75 dinners for the spaghetti dinner on Sat. night. Joanna asked specifically what the menu is so that ads could be drafted. Answer: spaghetti, meatballs, salad and garlic bread are on the menu. Club members will supply cake for dessert. Bob said the Marines indicated that spaghetti is the hardest dinner to do. Al Finnegan is the caretaker for the Madrid Facility. Field trip sign-up and departures are from the club house. **Auction is in the Marine** Corps League Building. Some comments were that it is very hot inside that is why the auction was outside last year. But when it gets dark you can't see the minerals and all bets are off in case of inclement weather.
