He spoke about the Adirondack Mountains: "Plutonic Mountains" of intrusive provenance or origin. He gave us the "low-down" on Hackmanite, a photosensitive fluorescent mineral. Also talked about triboluminescent rocks and mineral polymorphs, then polishing rocks and finally -- pseudomorphs. Thank You Dave for a great talk! Dave said he would need 3, 8' tables and 12 chairs for his gem tree classes at the Canton Pavilion. The week after the show Dave will be at Higley Flow Nature Center giving talks to children from 12-5 PM beginning with one hour of "Show and Tell", followed by the classes.

Bill disbursed the maps and signs to members to be placed around the North country as soon as possible.
